## Other People's Pictures by Lorca Sheppard and Cabot Philbrick with Packrat by Kris Brit Montag

**OTHER PEOPLE'S PICTURES** (FEATURE DOCUMENTARY) Nine obsessive collectors share an unlikely addiction: snapshots that have been abandoned or lost by their original owners and are now for sale. Ready to pay hundreds of dollars for a single picture, these collectors hunt for the images that feed their fantasies and quiet the voices in their heads. See what they find and learn why they want it in this surprising look at the little-known world of vintage snapshot collecting. 53 min.



**PACKRAT** (SHORT DOCUMENTARY) Filmmaker Kris Montag traces her family's struggle to deal with "packratting." Through family interviews, she chronicles her father's life and the development of the problem, which clinical professionals have addressed as a symptom of Obsessive Compulsive Disorder. Part personal, and part informational, Packrat takes a look at what it's like to grow up in a family where hoarding is an issue. 28 min.

## Bernie by Jay Heyman with Living with Slim by Sam Kaufman

**Bernie** is a story about the varied interpretations of the family unit. As filmmaker Jay Heyman grew older, he was compelled to document the story of his grandfather. Grandpa Bernie grew up in the Hebrew Orphan Asylum in New York City, never knowing a parent and never having an identity of his own. After spending eleven years there as an "inmate", he returned to the institution as a professional social worker in an effort to bring about much needed change. Amidst professional success, Bernie suffered through the premature losses of loved ones, yet moved forward to create new relationships with a contagious enthusiasm that lasted almost ninety-seven years. 62 min. (*Best Documentary, WHFF 2005*)

**Living with Slim: Kids Talk About HIV/AIDS** Director and Boston University film professor Sam Kauffmann captures with startling honesty the lives of seven African children-boys and girls, ranging in age from six to seventeen-infected with the HIV virus. The reality of the HIV/AIDS epidemic in Africa is stark; three of the children have lost both parents and three have lost one parent to AIDS. All seven discuss how old they were when they found out they were HIV positive; how they felt when they first learned they were infected; how they are treated at home and at school; and how the illness affects their daily lives. They also talk about their dreams for the future, and the career paths they hope to follow some day. The film's title references the fact that in many African countries, HIV/AIDS is called "Slim." 29 min. (*Best Short Documentary, WHFF 2005*)
